Pursuant to Article 13(1) and (2) of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (hereinafter: GDPR), we inform you that:

Personal data are processed for the purposes related to initiating and conducting the procedure for awarding the doctoral degree pursuant to Article 345 of the Act of 20 July 2018 – Law on Higher Education and Science (Journal of Laws 2018, item 1668), in connection with Article 6(1)(c) of the GDPR.
4. The personal data of candidates will not be transferred to third countries or international organizations.
5. The data of candidates whose proceedings have been initiated will be processed for the purpose of carrying out the procedure and stored for a period of 50 years.
6. Each data subject has the right to access their data and rectify them. Each person also has the right to request the deletion or restriction of processing of their data or to object to processing, as well as the right to data portability. Each person has the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority.
7. Providing personal data is required in order to consider the application to initiate the procedure. Providing personal data is mandatory under the aforementioned legal provisions.

9. After the initiation of the procedure for conferring the degree/title, personal data will be processed in order to carry out the procedure and to fulfill other legal obligations of the controller associated therewith.
